Birthstone of the Month - Diamond

The white/clear Diamond is April's birthstone. Formed within the earth where there is intense heat and pressure, Diamonds are simply crystallized carbon. Volcanic activity brought these gemstones to the earth's surface. Today these gemstones are found primarily in Australia, the Soviet Union and Africa.

No more notable in its uncut state than a plain pebble upon the beach, the true beauty of the Diamond was not revealed until the 16th century, when gemstone cutting and polishing techniques were perfected. Their value and appeal depends largely upon how skillfully they are cut and faceted.
