Section I - Committee:

1. Club Activities under Lockdown Level 1

Our re-opening of the clubhouse nearly one month ago went very well and members are slowly but surely returning to enjoy their hobby. We thank everyone who duly embraced the new situation and adhered to all the rules and regulations set out in the previous newsletter. These rules remain in place even though we have recently been downgraded by the Government to Lockdown Level 1. Once again we thank you all for your cooperation and understanding.

The extra open day on Wednesdays has also been popular especially by those who want to avoid the Saturday crowd. Thursday evenings and Saturdays attendance is picking up. Bernard has also reintroduced the Lapidary Sunday. Please check our Calendar of Events (pg.3) for the opening details.

Entry rules (repeat from the previous newsletter):

The duty members will also act as the Covid-officials for that day. Please note that he/she will have the authority to allow entry to the clubhouse and also manage/restrict the number of people inside.

- No face mask no entry to the workshops. Face masks must be worn the whole time you spend at the workshop. Please note – a face screen may be worn for additional protection but does not replace a face mask.
- The Covid-official will then ask you to complete the registration form, take your temperature and record it on the form and ask you to sanitize your hands, before entry. <u>Should your temperature</u> exceed 37.5 degrees we cannot allow you access into the clubhouse/workshops.
- No aprons will be provided by the club please bring your own; waterproof aprons are sold at most hardware stores (Chamberlains, Builders Warehouse, etc.)
- The kitchen remains closed to all. Cooldrinks may be bought at the duty desk; however, no eating
 or drinking will be allowed inside the clubhouse. You are welcome to enjoy your food/drinks outside.
- To comply with the social distancing rules (1.5m) we have closed-off certain workstations. This means that you may not use them. Only one person may be working at each open workstation, i.e. no sharing or waiting for the use of grinding wheels, trim saws or slabbing saws. Only one trim saw will be available for cutting we therefore restrict the use of it to trimming only (no cutting of small stones), to give everyone a fair chance. Only 1 person may work on the flat lap. Weather permitting, we can put 4 mobile lapidary machines and 1 faceting machine outside to provide extra workspace.
- No towels are allowed in the toilets paper towels have been provided.
- The library will be open to members, however only two persons max. are allowed at that table.
- No socializing and/or trading of minerals etc. inside the clubhouse; this applies also to rainy days! Traders must bring their own tables and chairs and set-up in the garden area outside.
- To ensure adequate ventilation the clubhouse windows and main entrance door will remain open.
- Plastic buckets will be made available at the tabs outside for washing/rinsing of rocks.

Please note that these rules are not negotiable and your full co-operation is required to make this a success and keep each other as safe as possible. Please do not come to the club if you had contact with someone testing positive for Covid-19 or if you are feeling sick, thank you.

2. Annual General Meeting 2020



The *Annual General Meeting* has been scheduled by the Committee for *Saturday, 10th October 2020 at 13:00* at the clubhouse. Weather permitting we will hold the meeting outside to adhere to the social distancing rules. The new club committee will also be elected on that day. After the meeting we will hold a *Live Auction* of rocks and minerals, books and magazines and possible used machinery.



Opal – Birthstone of October (see photos pages 1 and 3)

Common Opal has a milky appearance. Menilite is a brown impure variety, other varieties are Girasol, Hyalite, Cacholong, and Geyserite. The crystal structure of Opal (hydrous silicon dioxide) is amorphous. Opal miners restrict the use of the term opal to precious opal, calling material that does not show a good play of colours 'potch'. Precious Opal has a peculiar play of colours and is highly esteemed as a gem. One kind, with a varied play of color in a reddish ground, is called Harlequin Opal. The Fire Opal has colours like the red and yellow of flames.

5. Stopover at VN Mining, Nelspruit Mpumalanga report by Heidi Naudé

Hello Rockhounds, this is just a short report regarding a quick stopover on our way home from the Kruger National Park recently. Our newer members might not be familiar with VN Mining and their rocks and minerals. Their sign "VN Mining" is very overgrown with vegetation and hardly visible from the main road. Their main business is tumbling rocks on big scale, this alone is quite amazing to see.



They get their raw materials from various places; above are some samples of the interesting rocks they work with (Magnetsite/Howlite, Blue Lace Agate, Lepidolite and even some Orange River Crystals). There was also Verdite, Buddstone, Puddingstone, Rose Quartz, Amethyst, Mugglestone, Tiger's Eye, Aragonite and all varieties of Jasper.
